May 2019 – Meeting Highlights

Planning Council – May 13

Doug Hupponen received a service award for 10 years and Tony Van Dam received a Federal award for being on the Fire Service for 30 years - many thanks to Doug and Tony from Council, staff and residents.

Shore Road Allowance purchases were approved for 249 Wesley Road and 10352 Georgian Bay Shore.

Removal of a Hold (H) Provision was granted for 3814 Island 1810, Parcels A and B.

Council approved a Zoning By-law Amendment and Site Alteration for 308 O'Hara Point Road.

Conditions of Draft Approval for Subdivision for Files S2005-5 and S2005-6 were extended (Middleton Subdivision) for two years.

Council approved the workplan provided by Planning staff and added that Holding Provisions and Study Requirements be added and the Definition of Waterfront be modified to be a high priority.

Council directed staff to meet with Tom Bain, peer review consultants and proponent consultants regarding the Macey Bay Development. Staff will be scheduling an Open House once all comments from Peer Reviewers have been submitted.

Council also requested that Ainley & Associates as well as Azimuth Environmental provide information to the Township regarding the sewage works and the amount of units able to be built at Macey Bay.

The Planning Committee was directed to look at the presentation of Planning reports, site visits and lead time for Planning Reports; they were also directed to elect their own Chair at their first meeting.

Council – May 13

Council approved the 2018 Draft Financial Statements.

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The second phase of Subdivision Agreement S2005-5 was approved (Middleton Subdivision).

The updated Committee Terms of Reference was adopted.

A renewal of the Shared Services Agreement with Town of Penetanguishene for Human Resources / Health and Safety staff was approved.

Council approved the Tax Rate By-law.

Council directed Staff to apply for an accept funding from Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program for road repairs on Ogemawahj Road with budgeted funds being reallocated to repairing Baxter Loop, Metis Road, Lamoureaux Lane, Minor's Bay Road and Lily Pond Road projects.

Dana Suddaby, Planner, was appointed to the GBBR Climate Action Steering Committee.

Large Item Pick-Up dates for the summer were approved.

Emergency Response and Automatic Aid By-laws were adopted, as well as an updated Procedural By-law.

Special Council – May 14

Council adopted the Development Charges By-law.

Committee of the Whole – April 9

Committee heard four delegations.

The schedule for the 2020 Budget was approved and recommended to Council.

Committee also recommended that Council increase the budget for the Stewart Lake Pavilion to increase LED lighting.
